The Inception Meeting took place in a relaxed way, the 20 participants introduced themselves and presented the projects they worked on and the expertise they gained in working with Romani children and adults from the community. They were interested in the presentations from the first and second part of the meeting, mainly on the similarities and differences existing in the Roma Communities living in the countries of the project; they also emphasized the interesting parts of the school systems presented by us. The most important part of the meeting was the one in which we discussed the Competence Matrix. We tried to determine the main factors responsible for the early school leaving of Romani children.














Thessaloniki, Greece

The Aeliapath team successfully organized a meeting on October 20, 2023, bringing together educational mediators and policymakers dedicated to the issues of Romani youth and children. During the gathering, we introduced the European program, Pallab, outlining its objectives and anticipated outcomes. We engaged in discussions about the goals of the initiative and talked extensively about the specific needs of educators. This dialogue was crucial in laying the groundwork for the subsequent development of an educational tool tailored to address these needs, ensuring effective training for all involved parties.













ECF Bulgaria

On 21st of October 2023 Educational Cooperation Foundation team organised the Inception meeting for our project, gathering 20 professionals in the beautiful village of Ribaritsa. The majority of the participants were teachers with more than 10 years' experience working with Romani children and their families.

Following the Inception meeting agenda, our team presented the project, its details, WP2, all achieved results, future steps and led an important discussion on the skills and competences that are required by teachers in order to apply the suggested tools and methods for fighting early school leaving of Romani children. The topics were well received with a huge Interest from the audience. The participants were highly engaged, had the opportunity to ask questions, make comments and share their experience as people working with Romani children and adults on a daily basis and facing different problems.















Inception meeting in Brussels

"On the 27th of November, PAL Network welcomed in Brussels more than 25 experts from the wider area of education to exchange know-how and expertise on teachers working with Romani children and other socially excluded groups. Following the presentation of the project and the initial research findings in all partner countries, an extensive and interesting discussion was developed concerning the necessary skills and competences of teachers, mediators and tutors in order to develop and implement the indicated methods and techniques for reducing and eliminating early school leaving. Participants used their vast experience in working with Romani children to analyse their behaviour and tendency to drop out of school even in early stages. Moreover, they presented their justified views on the competences they need to develop to combat early school leaving. Our Inception Meeting ended with a common lunch in a nearby restaurant where the discussion and networking continued."














INTERNATIONAL HEALTH FAIR in ANKARA
